Rug hooking as we know it today got its start on the Eastern seaboard of North America. Using canvas foundations and a bent nail, seafaring men of the 1800s hooked chafing wraps to protect the ship's rigging. Their wives quickly adapted the process, turning worn-out clothing into practical and beautiful floor coverings.

This form of recycling was so popular that peddlers soon started selling stamped designs on burlap so that more intricate patterns could be produced.



Today, hooked rug artists have at their disposal an amazing array of hooks, frames, patterns and backings and cutters. New devotees are eagerly joining this tradition at an amazing pace. 
