REGISTRATION

REGISTRATION FOR THE 2015 ATHA BIENNIAL IN SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS BEGINS ONLINE SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 7, 2015 AT 9:00 AM CENTRAL STANDARD TIME.

All registrations include a registration fee. The registration fee for ATHA members is \$50, which allows you to go to the Vendor Marketplace, Rug Exhibit, participate in free demonstrations, attend all the evening ticketed functions, and receive a Welcome Bag from Region 9. Registration fee for non-members is \$76, which includes a year's membership to ATHA.

On, or after SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 7, 2015, when you register, go to <u>www.atharugs.com</u>, click on 2015 Biennial, then Registration. Please assist anyone in your ATHA chapter or local area who does not have internet access, in completing their registration. Please complete it manually and transfer the information to the online registration form in February when you register online. You will register for Biennial, select your classes, meals, tours, and submit payment using a credit card or your PayPal account. Information about the classes, teachers, their projects, and the schedule will be easily accessible as you go through the registration process.

When you register, you will be able to see how many spaces are available in a particular class. Designating first, second and third choice is not necessary as it was in the past. If the class is full, you can put your name on the waiting list, and you won't be charged for the class until a space becomes available. Since a space might not become available, you may wish to register for your second choice. Once you have submitted payment, an email registration confirmation will be sent to you. CLASSES

All classes are one-day classes and have a \$70.00 fee in addition to any Materials fee (listed in the class schedule beginning on page 54), and includes a deli lunch. Teachers will contact registered students to make these arrangements; please do not email your teacher until you are contacted.

BANQUET SPEAKER JAN WHITLOCK

Jan Whitlock is the co-author and publisher of American Sewn Rugs: Their History with Exceptional Examples. American Sewn Rugs is an authoritative book about sewn rugs and their significance in early American textiles. These rugs are the precursors to hooked rugs and play a prominent part in the history of rug hooking. Whitlock's most lasting contribution to scholarship may be her documentation of dozens of schools from Maine to Tennessee that, between 1805 and 1839, taught rug making, a mark of refinement, to affluent young women.

Jan comes to the Biennial with a long list of credentials. She is a former textile designer turned collector and antiques dealer, who brings an acute eye to the textile market. She has been a guest curator for an exhibition of sewn rugs and needlework at the Henry Francis du Pont Winterthur Museum. Jan Whitlock Textiles was established in 1999 in Chadds Ford, Pennsylvania. She is recognized as a leading source for antique textiles—including, but not limited to, embroidered blankets, sewn rugs, and rare quilts.

Ms. Whitlock has been an expert in the field of design and textiles nearly three decades, with a career spanning from an executive in the corporate textile world to an intimate boutique design business. As a collector and dealer of antique textiles, she has exhibited in elite shows, including the Winter Antiques Show and the Philadelphia Antiques Show. Pieces from her collection are in the permanent collections of the DAR Museum, the Henry Francis du Pont Winterthur Museum, the Connecticut Historical Society, the Milwaukee Art Museum, the Chester County Historical Society, the University of Nebraska Quilt Collection, and the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston.

The 2015 Biennial comes to a close after the Saturday evening banquet. Be sure to have hotel accommodations to stay Saturday evening!

Problem Rugs — Gene Shepherd — Saturday (no photo)

Got a problem rug that needs help? Let Gene help you fix it. Early registrants for this class will provide photos and their personal assessment of their problems (March 1 deadline) so that Gene can study their problems and recommend suitable technique, design and or fiber options needed for a fix. Should they desire hand-dyed wool, he will provide that for an extra per yard fee and he will also have more wool with him for the class. While the class will begin with a discussion of the problem rugs being worked on, most of the day will be spent in hands-on correction. Materials fee \$25 will cover pre-class consultations, handouts and media presentation the day of the class.

Understanding Color — Carla Fortney — Thursday (no photo)

This class will introduce you to a hands-on approach to color. Based on the work of the artist Josef Albers, we will do color exercises using colored paper. This process leads to a more intuitive understanding of the three properties of color - hue, value, and intensity - as well as how colors relate and react to each other. This approach involves training the eyes rather than memorizing the color wheel. All materials will be supplied, including a pack of over 200 colored papers. Materials fee \$50.00

Color Planning with Prismacolors — Bea Brock — Saturday

Please NOTE: Bea's Fiesta Color Needlepunch has been moved to Thursday.

In a quandary about where to start with color planning your rug? This class will familiarize you with the use of Prismacolor colored pencils that will prove to be a useful tool to begin the process of fun planning. We'll begin with discussing sources of color inspiration. Colored pencil techniques will be practiced, and at the end of class you will have the tools you need to continue color planning in this way. In class we will also discuss color theory, blending, adjusting color, and dealing with errors in color application. Bring multiples of a line drawing of your prospective rug patterns or use one of Bea's designs to work on. Please bring a set of 48 (or larger) Prismacolor brand colored pencils (two students may share one set). Materials fee \$35.00

The Witch Workshop — April DeConick — Friday

Get ready for Halloween by creating this wonderfully wicked portrait of Matilda the Witch. The mat measures 13" by 16" finished but includes sufficient wool to enlarge with Halloween border. April will cover the basics of Zonalism , an easy technique she developed to simplify the process of hooking faces and other subjects. She will also teach you what she has learned over the years about color and value. Then you will work from a kit to begin hooking Matilda using cut #6. You will learn all the basics of portrait hooking in this class, with Matilda as the subject. The kit includes the pattern, visuals, instructions, and seven Red Jack Wool Palette Packs. Each pack contains 1/4 yard hand-dyed wool in eight values. There is enough wool to finish the mat and bind it with wool show binding. April will contact you in advance to send you the pattern to transfer onto your preferred foundation and bring to the workshop. However, there will be sufficient wool in the kit to enlarge the rug with a charming halloween border, if the student chooses to do so. Suggestions for borders will be included in the pattern." Materials fee is \$125.
